Sermon Title:
“By Faith: Christ’s Power and Grace in both Salvation and Sanctification” - *Pastor Charles R. Biggs*

Sermon Theme: We rejoice in God’s grace to us in Christ as we continue to celebrate the Reformation of the 16th century this morning. In the Reformation, justification by faith alone, or the heart of the Gospel, was recovered and once again made clearly known through preaching and teaching in the Church.
