Sermon Title: “Lord, Teach Us To Pray”

Scripture Lesson: Romans 8:12-20

Scripture Text: Luke 11:1-4

Theme of Worship Service: Jesus teaches us in a simple form whom to pray to, the focus of prayer, and the need of prayer.

Questions to Prepare Your Heart For Worship

2. Why do you think we are direct to pray to God as our “Father”?
