**“The Grace of Giving and Generosity, Part 1”**

Dear family in Jesus, let us seek to flourish in the grace of magnanimously generous giving. Because of God’s grace to us, let us eagerly desire to honor and glorify God in Christ by “crowning” our King in the extension and advancement of His Kingdom to the ends of the earth!

**Christ has made us rich!** We were impoverished, poor and naked before God (Rev. 3:17), without any righteousness to offer Him, and nothing but a weight of guilt, sin and debt to God. Christ put aside all of His glorious riches to make us abundantly rich and gloriously clothed in Him (2 Cor. 8:9).

**Christ has given us His mind!** Remember our one-ness in the Gospel—others’ interests should be more important than our own (Phil. 2:2-4)! Let us give to each other because we are united to one another as one body in Jesus by His Spirit at KCPC. May there never be needs in our congregation that we are aware of but do not seek to meet as a congregation. If we cannot be generous to our brothers, how can we ever serve our enemies and the world as we are called to do?

**Christ has given us faith and works in our union with Him!** Remember your faith and your love being demonstrated in your works (Jas. 2:14-18). Remember to prove your love to Christ and one another (2 Cor. 8:8, 24). You say you love God; show it! Jesus said: “If you love me, keep my commandments.”

Excel in the grace of giving generously (2 Cor. 8:7)! Let us show our love for God and one another and our abundant joy and thanksgiving by giving toward tangible needs. Be faithful to tithing, giving, and generosity in general. Do you believe that you can be magnanimously generous, that Jesus can be your ultimate portion and possession and treasure, and that you can be a greater giver (2 Cor. 9:6-8)? In Christ, we have all we need. He is full of the grace of generosity and giving—this, too, is our inheritance in union with Him!

Here are some “objections” we may raise as to why we cannot, do not, or will not give generously:

**“But I’m really already stretched financially!”** If you’re “stretched”, God knows it and will provide for you (Psalm 37:23-26); He is Jehovah Jireh! Your giving is an act of faith, and this grace will be returned to you. Through sacrificial giving you learn to be content in any situation (Phil. 4:10-23). The Apostle Paul teaches that we can do “all things” through Christ who strengthens us, whether we living in abundance or need. God promises to meet our needs and use us to meet the needs of others (Phil. 4:19; 2 Cor. 8:14-15).

**“But I tithe, isn’t that enough?”** Thanks be to God for your tithing; that is a great start! The tithe is to show our utter dependence upon God; all that we have or will ever possess comes from God (1 Cor. 4:7). We are to be willing not merely to give a tithe (10%), but to give all of ourselves and our possessions (Luke 14:26ff). Giving helps us to avoid idolatry and weighing ourselves down on our pilgrimage with too much prosperity. We give back to God as His steward-managers, recognizing the danger of relying on our savings plan rather on the God who has saved us!

**“But, I am in so much debt.”** God knows that we will have some form of debt at many times in life, and while we can prayerfully and wisely seek to be debt-free, the cause of our debt is often that we are consumers by nature rather than producers (Prov. 11:24-25). Let us pay our debts faithfully to the glory of God while putting God first in our priorities and seeking to produce more for His kingdom. Ask God to search your heart (Psa. 139:23-24), repent of greed and selfishness, and find mercy and grace in Christ (Heb. 4:16).

**“But I can give so little.”** Give your widow’s mite; give your few fish and loaf of bread; give what you can and watch and pray that Jesus in His grace might multiply it. Perhaps your small gift will inspire others to give out of their abundance! If there is readiness to give, it is from God and acceptable (2 Cor. 8:12).

Let us show our love for God in our giving and generosity, knowing He will do above and beyond what we can ever ask or imagine (Eph. 3:20-21). Let us excel in the grace of giving today, especially as we receive the OPC Thank Offering this week and as we seek to increase our generosity in the coming year!

## Questions for Meditation/Reflection

- *Children: Read Psalm 37:4: The Bible teaches us to “delight” ourselves in the LORD. What does this mean? What does it mean to “fret”? Write this out in your own personal journal, and share it with others in your family. Do you delight daily? In what specific way(s)? Do you fret? In what specific way(s)?*
- *Review of last Lord's Day sermon (1 Sam. 9): Read 1 Chronicles 10:13-14. In what two specific ways did Saul fail in his service to God? What does this teach you?*
- *Read Psalm 37. There is an important contrast between the wicked/godless and the righteous/godly in Psalm 37. List all of the truths about the wicked and all the truths about the righteous, and make this a list for thanksgiving to God and prayer.*
- *What is the believer's ultimate hope according to Psalm 37? What is the believer's ultimate destination?*
- *What does it mean that God will “give you the desires of your heart” (Psa. 37:4)?*
